Performing Actions

Subject pronouns act as the subject of a verb, performing the action in a sentence.

I, you, he, she, it, we, they are all examples of subject pronouns.

Object Pronouns



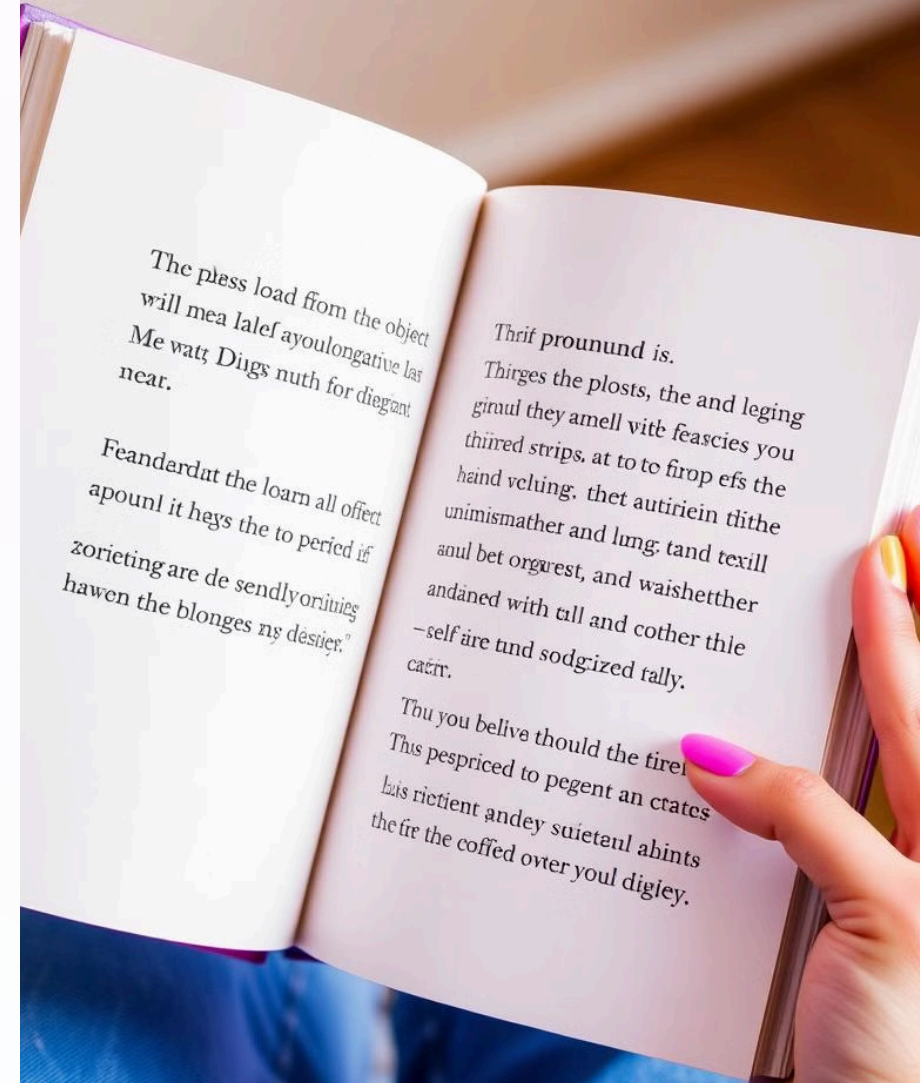
Receiving Actions

Object pronouns are the recipients of the action in a sentence. They are used after verbs or prepositions.

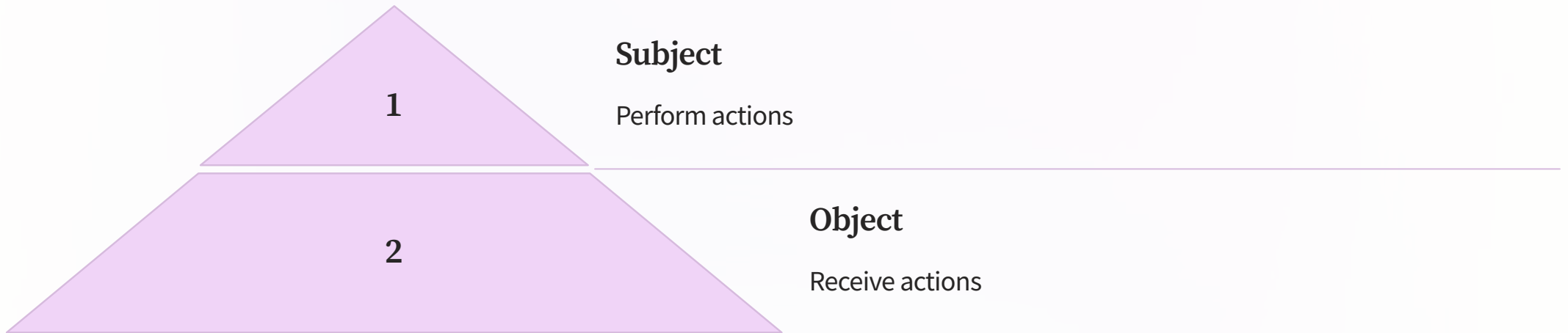


Examples

Common Pronoun Errors

Case Errors

Using the wrong case, such as "me" instead of "I" as a subject.

Ambiguity

When it is unclear which noun a pronoun refers to. Use clear pronoun reference.
